Highly supported by Goethe Institute the Sisters have travelled through Germany, to Senegal and Italy and gave workshops in various schools and institutes. Last year they were working together with Welthaus Bielefeld e. V., in Cooperation with the Sport Headquarters and FIFA. They participated in the project Women Voices and held various workshops in the area of Bielefeld with the title, "Sisters In Tolerances".

Currently the Sisters are working with **Plan International** on a project called "**Because I am a Girl**" which is a natural "calling" for them because it all revolves around strengthening the rights of young woman and girls. They have done a song featuring the "Girls go for Goals"-Allstars, which is also called "**Because I am a Girl**".
